‘Construction of the National Conveyor Project Readiness Infrastructure - Bulks 1, 2 and 6

Tender No. 2/SW/2026

The Ministry of Water and Irrigation/ Water Authority of Jordan (WAJ), hereinafter referred to as “the Client”, has signed a FARA (Fixed Amount Reimbursement Agreement) with the United States Government (USG), hereinafter referred to as “the Funding Agency”, in which the USG will provide funds towards the cost of the **Construction of Bulk 1, Bulk 2, and Bulk 6 of the National Conveyor Project Readiness Infrastructure**, hereinafter referred to as “the Bulk 1 Project” , “the Bulk 2 Project”, and “the Bulk 6 Project”.

The Jordanian Ministry of Water and Irrigation is in the final stage of signing the National Conveyor Project (NCP) contract to desalinate 300 million Cubic Meters per year (MCM/year) of seawater at the Gulf of Aqaba of which 250 MCM/year will be supplied to the two Delivery Points in Amman (Abu Alanda exiting reservoir and Al Muntazah new reservoir).

The NCP Readiness Infrastructure Program comprises set of priority bulk water, transmission, storage, and associated infrastructure investments required to ensure that the NCP is fully operational and capable of delivering desalinated water to end users. The NCP Readiness Infrastructure Program includes the construction of the essential backbone facilities including main transmission pipelines, pump stations, and terminal reservoirs in Amman, Aqaba and other governorates, thereby establishing the infrastructure necessary to receive the desalinated water and convey it to the customers throughout the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan. The NCP Readiness Infrastructure Program includes several construction Bulks (Packages). This notice is related specifically to the highest priority packages, namely Bulk1 and Bulk 2 in Amman and Bulk 6 in Aqaba.

Bulk 1: Abu Alanda – Tareq Water Transmission System

The proposed Bulk 1 project will include the construction of the following main components:

1. Supply and installation of 1.9 km of new 1800 mm diameter steel pipeline. This new pipeline will be connected to the existing 1600 mm header outlet from the reservoir and extended to a new distribution chamber in Abu Alanda area.
2. Supply and installation of 18.5 km of new 1400 mm diameter transmission steel pipeline to be connected from the distribution chamber in bullet 1 above in Abu Alanda area to a new terminal reservoir in Tareq area.
3. Supply and install 11.8 km of new 800 mm ductile iron pipeline (DIP) as a branch from the 1,400 mm pipeline near Tareq area to a new proposed reservoir in Juraiba area.
4. Supply and install 700m of 1200mm steel pipeline and 8.4 km of new 600 mm ductile iron pipeline (DIP) from the new Tareq Reservoir to the exiting Shafa Badran Lower reservoir in Shafa Badran Area.
5. Construction of several trenchless crossings of main roads.

6. Construction of a new 50,000 cubic meter reinforced-concrete terminal rectangular reservoir with two compartments in Tareq area.
7. Construction of a new 28,000 cubic meter new reinforced-concrete rectangular reservoir with two compartments in Yajouz area.
8. Construction of new electrical plus administration buildings, one each at the Juraiba and Tareq reservoir sites.
9. Construction of new chlorination buildings and equipment, one each at the Juraiba and Tareq reservoir sites.
10. Construction of new site roadways and security features (fencing, guardhouses, exterior lighting, CCTV, fire alarms and access control) at new reservoir sites.
11. Supply and installation of all required new isolation valves, water meters, air release valves, combination air release and vacuum valves, washouts, fittings, and other accessories.
12. Construction of new distribution and valve chambers as required.
13. Install new instruments, PLC and local SCADA system with servers and workstations at the new reservoirs and connect to the Main Control Center at Dabouq.
14. Construction of all earthworks associated with new pipelines and reservoirs.
15. Construction of new cathodic protection systems for new pipelines.

Bulk 2: Muntazah – Dabouq Water Transmission System

The proposed Bulk 2 project will include the construction of the following main components:

1. Construction of a new air gap structure as a receiving station from the 1,300 mm diameter NCP steel pipeline (by others) and a new 1,100 mm diameter steel pipeline overflow to an existing culvert.
2. Construction of new 50,000 and 20,000 cubic meter reservoirs in Al Muntazah existing site. The reservoirs will be constructed in stages starting with the 20,000 m³ reservoir to ensure continuity of water supply to different areas in Amman.
3. Furnish and install three new temporary medium voltage constant speed pumps (900 m³/hour capacity at 161 m head) in the new 20,000 m³ Muntazah reservoir along with ancillary facilities to make fully operational, and then to allow demolition of the existing Muntazah reservoir and pump station. Supply the temporary connection from the existing discharge pipe from Zara Ma'in Pump Station 6 to the new 20,000 cubic meter reservoir to provide water for temporary pumps.
4. Upon satisfactory commissioning of the temporary pump station, proceed with demolition the existing 6,000 m³ Al Muntazah reservoir, pump station and other miscellaneous existing associated infrastructure/small buildings to allow the construction of the new 50,000 m³ Muntazah reservoir in Stage 2.
5. Supply and installation of 21.6 km of new 1200 mm diameter steel pipeline from the new Al Muntazah Pump Station to Dabouq existing terminal reservoir, including connection to the existing Dabouq reservoir 1000 mm diameter header inlet.
6. Construction of several new trenchless crossings of main roads.
7. Supply and installation of four new permanent vertical turbine pumps (estimated capacity of 2000 m³/hour capacity and 210 m head) at the new 20,000 m³ Muntazah reservoir.
8. Construction of new Electrical/Administration Building at the Muntazah site and perform necessary modifications to the existing electrical building serving PS06 (in coordination with utility).
9. Provide 6.6 kV, 5.5 MVA new generator at Muntazah reservoir site.
10. Supply and installation of two new 60 m³ surge tanks at the Muntazah existing site.
11. Perform the necessary connection to existing pipelines and abandonment/demolition of selected pipelines in the vicinity of the Muntazah reservoir site.
12. Construction of new roadways and security features (fencing, guardhouses, exterior lighting, CCTV, fire alarms and access control) at the reservoir site.

13. Supply and installation all required new isolation valves, water meters, air release valves, combination air release and vacuum valves, surge anticipation valves, washouts, fittings, and other accessories.
14. Construction of new distribution and valve chambers as required.
15. Supply and Installation of new instruments, PLC and local SCADA system with servers and workstations at the new Muntazah Reservoirs and connect to the Main Control Center at Dabouq
16. Construction of all earthworks associated with new pipelines and reservoirs
17. Construction of new cathodic protection systems for new pipelines.

Bulk 6 – Aqaba Water Transmission System

The proposed Bulk 6 project will include the construction of the following main components:

1. Supply and installation of approximately 25 km of new 1000 mm diameter pipeline (ductile iron, with steel sections where required), extending from NCP Pumping Station 2 (to be constructed by others under the NCP) to the existing North Tank in Aqaba, including all associated connection works.
2. Supply and installation of all required new flow Control valves, isolation valves, water meters, air release valves, combination air release/vacuum valves, washouts, fittings, and other accessories.
3. Construction of new distribution and valve chambers as required.
4. Supply and Installation of new instruments, PLC and local SCADA system with servers and workstations at the new reservoir and connect to the Main Control Center at Aqaba Water Building.
5. Construction of new cathodic protection systems for new steel pipelines.
6. Construction of all earthworks associated with new pipelines and reservoirs

The Employer intends to prequalify contractors and/or firms for the “**Construction of NCP Readiness Bulk 1, Bulk 2 and Bulk 6 Projects**”. **These three projects will be issued for bid as three separate construction contracts.** Prequalified contractors will be invited to bid on one, two, or all bulks based on the results of the prequalification process. However, each bidder cannot be awarded more than two Bulks based on the capacity of each applicant. Awards will be made using the “Best Combination Selection” method that offers the best overall value of money for the Employer

A detailed design is under preparation for these projects. It is anticipated that invitations to bid for Bulks 1 and 2 will be issued to the prequalified contractors in the third quarter of 2026, and for Bulk 6 in the fourth quarter of 2026 with anticipated contract award and signing by the second and third quarters of 2027. Each contract is expected to be implemented within a period of 30 months to be ready to receive the new NCP water deliveries (by others) when available.

The employer invites interested international and Jordanian Contractors that meets the eligibility criteria of USG code 937 and satisfy the prequalification criteria set in the prequalification document to submit Prequalification Application to the subject construction contracts. Factors considered for the evaluation of applicants include: (i) financial capabilities; (ii) general and specific construction experience of the Contractors and their Key Subcontractors; (iii) organization and personnel capacity and experience; and (iv) construction equipment. Jordanian Contractors and Jordanian Specialized Subcontractors must meet Grade 1 classification in the field of water and wastewater according to the Government Tenders Department (GTD) of the Jordanian Ministry of Public Works and Housing. Prequalification will be conducted in accordance with WAJ procurement procedure and in line with USG source and nationality requirements.

One (1) original and two (2) hard and soft copies of the Application must be submitted in a sealed envelope marked from outside as below. In case of any discrepancy between the original hard submission and the hard or soft copies, the original will prevail.

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Section I. Instructions to Applicants (ITA)

A. General

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| 1. Scope of Application | <p>1.1 In connection with the Invitation for Prequalification, and as indicated in Section II, Prequalification Data Sheet (PDS), the Employer¹, as defined in the PDS, issues this Prequalification Document (“Prequalification Document”) to prospective applicants (“Applicants”) interested in submitting applications (“Applications”) for prequalification to bid for the Works described in Section V, Scope of Works.</p> <p>1.2 Prequalification will be conducted in accordance with the WAJ procurement procedure and the special requirements of the United States Government (USG).</p> |
| 2. Source of Funds | <p>2.1 The Employer has signed a FARA (Fixed Amount Reimbursement Agreement) with the USG, hereinafter referred to as “the Funding Agency”, in which the USG will provide funds towards the cost of the project named in the PDS, hereinafter referred to as “the Project”.</p> <p>2.2 Although various departments of the Government of Jordan and USG retain certain approval rights, they shall in no way be deemed as party to the Contract or be under any obligation to the Tenderer.</p> |
| 3. Corrupt and Fraudulent Practices | <p>3.1 Prohibited Conduct includes corruption, fraud, coercion, collusion, obstruction, misuse of the employer resources or assets, money laundering and financing of terrorism defined as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. A corrupt practice, which is the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting, directly or indirectly, anything of value to influence improperly the actions of another party. b. An obstructive practice, which means (a) destroying, falsifying, altering or concealing of evidence material to the investigation, or making false statements to investigators, with the intent to impede the investigation; (b) threatening, harassing or intimidating any party to prevent it from disclosing its knowledge of matters relevant to the investigation or from pursuing the investigation; or (c) acts intended to impede the exercise of the client contractual rights of audit or inspection or access to information. f. All applicants must fill out the certification regarding Terrorist Financing form included in Part IV. |

¹ Instead of Employer, the term Project Executing Agency or Contracting Authority might be used interchangeably.

4. Eligible Applicants

- 3.2 Applicants shall permit and shall cause their agents to permit the client, the USG and auditors appointed by either of them, the right to inspect and copy the books and records of the tenderer, contractor, supplier or consultant in connection with the executed contract.
- 4.1 For the purpose of applying the eligibility criteria listed in this Clause, references to the “Applicant” include all entities involved or intended to be involved with the proposed Works (including all partners and any of their affiliates that directly or indirectly control, or are controlled by or are under common control with the firm), consultants, manufacturers or suppliers, members, subcontractors, and the personnel of each, for any part of the contract including related services. For avoidance of doubt, the term “subcontractor” shall include Specialized Subcontractors (as defined below in section 4.3) as well as other subcontractors included in the Application or included by a prequalified Applicant in its Bid.
- 4.2 An Applicant may be a firm that is a private individual entity or a combination of such entities in the form of a joint venture (“JV”) under an existing agreement or with the intent to enter into such an agreement supported by a letter of intent. In the case of a JV, all members shall be jointly and severally liable for the execution of the Contract in accordance with the Contract terms. The JV shall nominate an authorized representative who shall have the authority to conduct all business for and on behalf of any and all the members of the JV during the prequalification process, bidding (in the event the JV submits a bid) and during contract execution (in the event the JV is awarded the Contract). Unless specified in the **PDS**, there is no limit on the number of members in a JV. The Leader of a Joint Venture shall be named in the prequalification documents to be submitted by the applicants. The participation of the Leader in the contract shall be at least 51%. The applicants shall indicate for the Joint Venture the participation (in percentage) of each Partner.
- 4.3 A firm may apply for prequalification individually as prime contractor, as part of a joint venture as a member, or as a subcontractor whose qualifications are included in the Application to meet one or more of the Section III Qualification Criteria and Requirements (“Specialized Subcontractor”). If prequalified, any such firm will not be permitted to bid for the same contract as a part of another joint venture. However, a firm may participate as a subcontractor in more than one bid, but only in that capacity.
- 4.4 Only Geographic Code 937 firms as defined in the United States Source and Nationality rules of 22 CFR 228 that satisfy the qualification criteria in Section III of this prequalification document are eligible to tender for the project. Prospective bidders may form joint ventures or consortia with other Geographic Code 937 firms and may prequalify on that basis. In the case of joint ventures, each member firm of the joint venture must meet the nationality and eligibility rules. However, the joint venture is treated as a unit in determining technical and other qualifications unless otherwise specified in the PDS. All members of a joint venture and all sub-contractors of an Applicant shall not be affiliated with a firm or entity for which none of the following reasons for exclusion apply:
- a) No contractor included on the list of suspended, debarred, or ineligible contractors maintained by the U.S. Government or the

Government of Jordan will be eligible to bid or to participate as a prime contractor or subcontractor or otherwise.

- b) Conflict of Interest: the Applicant is excluded from participating in a procurement procedure or contract because the Applicant is affected by a conflict of interest that cannot be remedied by other less intrusive measures. Conflict of interest occurs when the impartial and objective exercise of the functions of the employer, or the respect of the principles of competition, non-discrimination or equality of treatment with regard to the procurement procedure or contract, is compromised for reasons involving family, emotional life, political or national affinity, economic interest or any other shared interest. The concept of conflict of interest covers any situation where staff members (or consultants acting on behalf) of the Employer who are involved in the conduct of the procurement procedure or may influence the outcome of that procedure have, directly or indirectly, a financial, economic or other personal interest which might be perceived to compromise their impartiality and independence in the context of the procurement procedure or contract execution.
- c) The Applicant, including any subcontractor, shall not be associated or have had a business relationship with, nor have been associated or have had a business relationship with the Consultants, CDM International Inc., or the parent firm CDM Smith Inc., Sajdi-Consulting Engineering Center, and their subcontractors Engicon, Dar Al Handasah, and Orient in the preparation of the design, specifications, and bidding documents for the NCP Readiness Infrastructure Project. Any such association or business relationship will result in the rejection of the Application. The Applicant shall submit a statement certifying it has not had any such association or business relationship that would constitute a conflict of interest

5. Source of Commodities, Supplier of Commodities and Services

- 5.1 In accordance with the requirements of 22 CFR Part 228 Clause 228.11, the source and nationality of all commodities financed with Federal program funds appropriated under the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, shall be Code 937. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Employer is currently considering that specific equipment—namely **pumps, valves, chlorination system, motor control centers (MCCs), and the SCADA system**—may be required to comply with **Code 000** (United States) provisions. Final determination on this requirement will be communicated in the final tender documents.

Procurements of agricultural commodities, motor vehicles and pharmaceuticals must also comply with the special procurement rules in 22 CFR 228.19. Recipients and contractors are prohibited from engaging suppliers of commodities in an authorized country to import commodities from a country outside of the authorized principal geographic codes for the purposes of circumventing the requirements of this rule. Any violation of this prohibition will result in the disallowance by USG of the cost of the procurement of the subject commodity.

- 5.2 Foreign government-controlled organizations: As required by 22 CFR Part 228 Clause 228.13, firms operated as commercial companies or other organizations or enterprises (including non-profit organizations) in which foreign governments or their agents or agencies have a controlling interest

are not eligible as suppliers of commodities and services. Government ministries or agencies of the cooperating/recipient country, including those at the regional and local levels, and government educational institutions, health care providers, and other technical entities of the cooperating/recipient country not formed primarily for commercial or business purposes, are eligible as suppliers of commodities and services.

5.3 The nationality of suppliers of all commodities and services financed with federal program funds appropriated under the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, shall comply with the following requirements as stated in 22 CFR Part 228, Clause 228.12:

- a) If an individual, except as provided in 22 CFR Part 228, Clause 228.15, be a citizen or lawful permanent resident (or equivalent immigration status to live and work on a continuing basis) of a country in Code 937,
 - b) If an organization,
 - 1) Be incorporated or legally organized under the laws of a country in Code 937;
 - 2) Must be operating as a going concern in a country in Code 937, and either:
 - 3) Be managed by a governing body, the majority of whom are citizens or lawful permanent residents (or equivalent immigration status to live and work on a continuing basis) of countries in Code 937,
- or
- 4) Employ citizens or lawful permanent residents (or equivalent immigration status to live and work on a continuing basis) of a country in Code 937, in more than half its permanent full-time positions and more than half of its principal management positions.

5.4 Motor vehicles must be manufactured in the United States to be eligible for Federal program financing (22 U.S.C. 2396). However, financing transportation or driver services from an individual or commercial entity and not directly financing the purchase or lease of a vehicle, is subject to the requirements at 22 CFR Part 228 Clause 228.12. Financing transportation or driver services means:

- 1) The vehicle is independently owned or leased by the hired driver or company;
- 2) The vehicle will be maintained by the individual or commercial entity and driven only by the hired driver(s); and
- 3) The vehicle is not directly leased, either as a separate line item in the contract separate from the cost of the driver's services, or under a separate contract

5.5 Long-term leases: As required by 22 CFR Part 228 Clause 228.18, any commodity obtained under a long-term lease agreement as defined in 22 CFR Part 228 Clause 228.01, including motor vehicles, is subject to the source and nationality requirements, including the special procurement rules as set forth in 22 CFR Part 228 Clause 228.19

The Applicant shall provide verifiable evidence of a minimum of ten (10) years of previous experience in water infrastructure projects, including a proven track record of at least five (5) years of successfully implementing ESHS risk management measures directly at construction and work sites.

The Applicant must maintain valid corporate Environmental and Occupational Health and Safety Management Systems, such as ISO 14001 and ISO 45001, or verified equivalent. Qualification is strictly conditional upon the Applicant providing acceptable evidence demonstrating that these management systems are dynamically applied, audited, and enforced at the physical project and site level in its previous and ongoing projects, legally binding all field operations and subcontractors.

Section V. Eligibility Criteria

Eligibility of Services:

- At the Prequalification Stage, Applicants originating from all countries of the world are eligible to apply for the prequalification. However, upon award of the Contract, the Successful Bidder, together with its Contractors and Subcontractors, if not already incorporated as a Jordanian company, shall be required to establish a legal entity under the laws of Jordan and complete all required registrations, as follows:
 1. Where the Applicant is a Single Entity, it shall establish a Jordanian legal entity in accordance with Jordanian law and complete all required registrations.
 2. Where the Applicant is a member of a JV-Consortium, each such member shall establish a Jordanian legal entity in accordance with Jordanian law and complete all required registrations.
 3. Where the Applicant is a Joint Venture-Legal Entity, such Legal Entity shall be established in accordance with Jordanian law and complete all required registrations.
 4. Prequalified Contractors may engage Specialized Subcontractors and may engage other Subcontractors. In all cases, each Subcontractor shall establish a Jordanian legal entity in accordance with Jordanian law and complete all required registrations.

Each Applicant (whether a Single Entity, a JV partner, a JV-Legal Entity, or a Specialized Subcontractor) shall, as part of its Prequalification Application, submit a legally binding undertaking confirming its commitment to establish a Jordanian legal entity and complete all required registrations in the event it is awarded the Contract.

If a JV- Consortium member is a Jordanian contractor and already has an existing legally established and registered entity in Jordan, no additional establishment or registration is required for that member. All other foreign JV- Consortium members must **establish** their own Jordanian legal entities upon contract award, in accordance with the applicable laws.

Alternatively, upon contract award, the JV members may choose to establish a single JV-Legal Entity (an incorporated joint venture) in Jordan, which is jointly formed under Jordanian law by all JV members. In this case, the incorporated Jordanian JV-Legal Entity will serve as the contracting entity.

For clarity, a foreign company registered in Jordan as a foreign operating company shall not be considered as meeting the above requirement.

Other Considerations:

- Contractors debarred by the Government Tenders Department of Jordan shall declare this status.
- State-owned enterprises or institutions in the Employer's Country may participate only if they can establish that they (i) are legally and financially autonomous (ii) operate under commercial law, and (iii) are not dependent agencies of the Employer. To be eligible, a State-owned enterprise or institution shall establish to the Employer and the USG satisfaction, through all relevant documents, including its Charter and other information the Employer and USG may request, that it: (i) is a legal entity separate from the government (ii) does not currently receive substantial subsidies or budget support; (iii) operates like any commercial enterprise, and, inter alia, is not obliged to pass on its surplus to the government, can acquire rights and liabilities, borrow funds and be liable for repayment of its debts, and can be declared bankrupt; and (iv) is not bidding for a contract to be awarded by the department or agency of the government which

under their applicable laws or regulations is the reporting or supervisory authority of the enterprise or has the ability to exercise influence or control over the enterprise or institution.

PART 2 – Works Requirements

Section V. Scope of Works

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Section V. Scope of the Works

1. Description of the Works

The Jordanian Ministry of Water and Irrigation is in the final stage of signing a BOT (Build-Operate-Transfer) contract to desalinate 300 million cubic meter per year at the Gulf of Aqaba of which 250 million to be transferred to two main points in Amman; the existing Abu Alanda reservoir of 100,000 cubic meter capacity, and to the new Al Muntazah reservoirs (70,000 m³ total capacity) to be constructed at the existing Al Muntazah reservoir site.

The NCP Readiness project aims at the construction of main transmission pipelines, pump station, and terminal reservoirs in Amman to prepare the necessary infrastructure to receive the annual 250 million cubic meter of desalinated water from the BOT contract.

Bulk 1: Abu Alanda – Tareq Water Transmission System

The proposed Bulk 1 project will include the construction of the following main components:

1. Supply and installation of 1.9 km of new 1800 mm diameter steel pipeline. This new pipeline will be connected to the existing 1600 mm header outlet from the reservoir and extended to a new distribution chamber in Abu Alanda area.
2. Supply and installation of 18.5 km of new 1400 mm diameter transmission steel pipeline to be connected from the distribution chamber in bullet 1 above in Abu Alanda area to a new terminal reservoir in Tareq area.
3. Supply and install 11.8 km of new 800 mm ductile iron pipeline (DIP) as a branch from the 1,400 mm pipeline near Tareq area to a new proposed reservoir in Juraiba area.
4. Supply and install 500m of 1000 mm DIP and 8.4 km of new 600 mm ductile iron pipeline (DIP) from the new Tareq Reservoir to the exiting Shafa Badran Lower reservoir in Shafa Badran Area.
5. Construction of several trenchless crossings of main roads.
6. Construction of a new 50,000 cubic meter reinforced-concrete terminal rectangular reservoir with two compartments in Tareq area.
7. Construction of a new 28,000 cubic meter new reinforced-concrete rectangular reservoir with two compartments in Juraiba area.
8. Construction of new electrical plus administration buildings, one each at the Juraiba and Tareq reservoir sites.
9. Construction of new chlorination buildings and equipment, one each at the Juraiba and Tareq reservoir sites.
10. Construction of new site roadways and security features (fencing, guardhouses, exterior lighting, CCTV, fire alarms and access control) at new reservoir sites.
11. Supply and installation of all required new isolation valves, water meters, air release valves, combination air release and vacuum valves, washouts, fittings, and other accessories.
12. Construction of new distribution and valve chambers as required.
13. Install new instruments, PLC and local SCADA system with servers and workstations at the new reservoirs and connect to the Main Control Center at Dabouq.
14. Construction of all earthworks associated with new pipelines and reservoirs.
15. Construction of new cathodic protection systems for new pipelines.

Bulk 2: Muntazah – Dabouq Water Transmission System

The proposed Bulk 2 project will include the construction of the following main components:

1. Construction of a new air gap structure as a receiving station from the 1,300 mm diameter NCP steel pipeline (by others) and a new 1,100 mm diameter steel pipeline overflow to an existing culvert.

2. Construction of new 50,000 and 20,000 cubic meter reservoirs in Al Muntazah existing site. The reservoirs will be constructed in stages starting with the 20,000 m³ reservoir to ensure continuity of water supply to different areas in Amman.
3. Furnish and install three new temporary medium voltage constant speed pumps (900 m³/hour capacity at 161 m head) in the new 20,000 m³ Muntazah reservoir along with ancillary facilities to make fully operational, and then to allow demolition of the existing Muntazah reservoir and pump station. Supply the temporary connection from the existing discharge pipe from Zara Ma'in Pump Station 6 to the new 20,000 cubic meter reservoir to provide water for temporary pumps.
4. Upon satisfactory commissioning of the temporary pump station, proceed with demolition the existing 6,000 m³ Al Muntazah reservoir, pump station and other miscellaneous existing associated infrastructure/small buildings to allow the construction of the new 50,000 m³ Muntazah reservoir in Stage 2.
5. Supply and installation of 21.6 km of new 1200 mm diameter steel pipeline from the new Al Muntazah Pump Station to Dabouq existing terminal reservoir, including connection to the existing Dabouq reservoir 1000 mm diameter header inlet.
6. Construction of several new trenchless crossings of main roads.
7. Supply and installation of four new permanent vertical turbine pumps (estimated capacity of 2000 m³/hour capacity and 210 m head) at the new 20,000 m³ Muntazah reservoir.
8. Construction of new Electrical/Administration Building at the Muntazah site and perform necessary modifications to the existing electrical building serving PS06 (in coordination with utility).
9. Provide 6.6 kV, 5.5 MVA new generator at Muntazah reservoir site.
10. Supply and installation of two new 60 m³ surge tanks at the Muntazah existing site.
11. Perform the necessary connection to existing pipelines and abandonment/demolition of selected pipelines in the vicinity of the Muntazah reservoir site.
12. Construction of new roadways and security features (fencing, guardhouses, exterior lighting, CCTV, fire alarms and access control) at the reservoir site.
13. Supply and install all required new isolation valves, water meters, air release valves, combination air release and vacuum valves, surge anticipation valves, washouts, fittings, and other accessories.
14. Construction of new distribution and valve chambers as required.
15. Supply and Installation of new instruments, PLC and local SCADA system with servers and workstations at the new Muntazah Reservoirs and connect to the Main Control Center at Dabouq
16. Construction of all earthworks associated with new pipelines and reservoirs
17. Construction of new cathodic protection systems for new pipelines.

Bulk 6 – Aqaba Water Transmission System

The proposed Bulk 6 project will include the construction of the following main components:

1. Supply and installation of approximately 25 km of new 1000 mm diameter pipeline (ductile iron, with steel sections where required), extending from NCP Pumping Station 2 (to be constructed by others under the NCP) to the existing North Tank in Aqaba, including all associated connection works.
2. Supply and installation of all required new flow Control valves, isolation valves, water meters, air release valves, combination air release/vacuum valves, washouts, fittings, and other accessories.
3. Construction of new distribution and valve chambers as required.

4. Supply and Installation of new instruments, PLC and local SCADA system with servers and workstations at the new reservoir and connect to the Main Control Center at Aqaba Water Building.
5. Construction of all earthworks associated with the pipeline.

2. Procurement and Construction Schedule

The detailed design and tender documents are anticipated to be completed during the third and fourth quarters of year 2026. The bid documents are anticipated to be issued to prequalified firms upon completion of tender packages, with contract award and signing targeted for the second and third quarters of 2027. Time for Completion will be 24 months for each bulk, followed by a Defects Notification Period of 24 months from substantial completion date.

3. Site and Other Data

A detailed design is under preparation including technical specifications, drawings, BOQ, the related geotechnical investigations and the topographical surveys, and will be made available to tenderers during the tender period, but not during prequalification.

The contract will be awarded using the FIDIC Red Book Conditions of Contract, first edition 1999, published by FIDIC (the Fédération Internationale des Ingénieurs Conseils).

The Council of Ministers reviewed its Decision No. (3652) dated 12/9/2021 and your Excellency's aforementioned letter. To support national industry, the Council of Ministers decided, in its session held on 08/06/2026, to approve increasing the price preference percentage for national industries in government tenders to twenty percent (20%) instead of fifteen percent (15%). Furthermore, all ministries, official departments, public institutions and authorities, public universities, municipalities, joint service councils, the Greater Amman Municipality, companies wholly owned by the government, and companies in which the government's shareholding exceeds fifty percent (50%) shall be bound to comply with the aforementioned twenty percent (20%) preference percentage, provided that the products comply with Jordanian technical and engineering conditions and specifications. Otherwise, coordination regarding such matters shall be conducted with the Ministry of Industry, Trade, and Supply in exceptional and justified cases.

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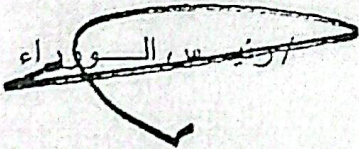
